Dream Come True

"Our local history is absolutely rich," thought Mrs. Josephine Bosworth, "and full of a fascinating mixture of folks that settled here so long ago." The more she thought about it, the more determined she became to save the treasures and wealth of that history. Josephine, also known as Aunt Jo, continued to muse on how it could be preserved and shared with future generations. She was not a lady to procrastinate, but swiftly and with conviction made up her mind! At full tilt and with tremendous resolution this was a *dream* that this vivacious lady wanted to *come true*. She wanted

the marvelous archives of the past to stay "alive" and honored --not to be diminished by time.

Being assertive, industrious, and full of imagination, ideas began to surface in Aunt Jo's mind. Different considerations and all of the pros and cons floated in and either stuck in her thoughts or else were quickly dismissed. Until! A spark blossomed! She kicked up her heels and off she ran with that spark! Excitement Myriads of possibilities mounted! flooded in until a vision was born. Aunt Jo was a very smart lady, and many of the angles that she could come up with were bounced around in very realistic and brilliant ways.

Finally, she couldn't stand it any longer. She just had to share her dream with others. Her passion was evident and was also quite contagious.

A MUSEUM! That was the spark that was the answer to the splendid dream to protect and to commemo-

rate the history of the Fall River Valley and the surrounding area.

By June 12, 1934, the interest in building a museum had grown and burgeoned and the dream began to unfold and was decidedly set in motion. First, the 'Fort Crook Historical Society' was formed. A group of nine persons signed a charter. The first officers were: President. Nora Selvester; First Vice-President, R. Jos-Bosworth; Second phine President, Wm Lundsford; Secretary, Elsie L. Bosworth; Asst. Secretary, Dorothy Burr; and Treasurer, Meade I. Reynolds.

The purpose of the Society was to: collect and record all historical data associated with the settlement of the Intermountain area which included parts of Shasta, Modoc, Lassen, and Siskiyou Counties; to collect and preserve anything that may have histori-

cal value; and to mark places of historical value. (Fort Crook, Beaver Creek School, Lockhart Ferry, Pittville School, Winter's Road and Winter's Cemetery are just a few of the sites that have been marked with historic placards by the Society over the years.)

On November 25th, 1934, the Charter Membership of the Society was closed with thirty-one members.



With persistence the Society began to flourish as interest continued to grow. The desire to be part of such an affluent addition in the valley, in such a rural area, shined on with pride. Dear Aunt Jo, with her huge and generous heart, bestowed the land on which the museum building was to be built. The dream and vision was further substantiated. More and more historical treasures were collected with ferver knowing that in time there would be a permanent home in which to place and to record those historic memoirs.

The conviction, diligence, perseverance, and adamancy of the small group fueled that awesome spark of Aunt Jo's *dream*. Much was accomplished in a short time as it fanned out into reality.

This year, 2024, marks the ninetieth anniversary of the Fort Crook Historical Society. The Museum now consists of a thirteen structure compound, and by many is still considered to be the "biggest little museum in northern California." The genesis of the museum was sparked when Josephine Bosworth first saw the value and wealth of the local history.

The ceaseless drive of this dynamic lady generated her dream to so superbly come true!
